Frequently Asked Questions

Why is community solar important?

Community solar increases access to solar energy. Traditionally, only single-family homes and businesses that installed rooftop solar were able to benefit from solar energy, but with community solar anyone who pays a Con Edison bill can save with solar!

What's the difference between community solar and ESCOs?

Community solar is not an ESCO. Community solar allows individual households to share one large, local solar energy system and reduce their entire electric Con Edison bill through solar credits - quaranteed. Meanwhile, ESCOs offer a variable rate of electricity through green energy sources such as wind, typically located outside of NYC.



What happens if I move?

If you move within the Con Edison territory (NYC and Westchester County), you can still be enrolled in the community solar project you signed up for. Unfortunately, if you move outside of the Con Edison territory, you will no longer be subscribed to the project. When you move, you'll need to let the community solar provider know so your contact information can be updated, or so you can be removed from the project.

I'm a renter how can I participate in community solar?

Renters are encouraged to sign up! Community solar allows anyone who pays a Con Edison bill to enroll in a project, which includes renters. You do not need to own the unit or building where you live to enroll in community solar. There are no sign-up or cancellation fees to participate.

How does community solar save me money?

As a subscriber, you will only pay for 90% of the value of the solar credits and the remaining 10% is pocketed savings. As a reminder, the solar credit is applied to your Con Edison bill, lowering your charges.
