## Fifth Avenue Committee Introduces Barrio Solar Pilot Program

New York, NY September 28,2021 - Fifth Avenue Committee, with generous support from Enterprise Community Partners and in partnership with Solar One, is piloting an exciting new program to provide education and financial assistance to New York City homeowners while promoting the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. Barrio Solar, a community-based group solar campaign, will provide Solar Photovoltaic (Solar PV) energy to low-to-moderate-income (LMI) households in New York City to ensure more equitable access to the benefits of solar. The program will address localized problems in Solar PV installations and support homeowners in the installation process from start to finish, establishing a transparent approach to estimating costs, savings, and timelines. Homeowners will benefit from the compounded purchasing power of the group, making the cost of adoption sustainable. The highlight of this program is an unrivaled incentive of \$3,500 in cash subsidies that qualified homeowners can use towards the cost of solar installations.

FAC and Solar One are hosting a virtual launch event on October 5, 2021 at 12pm for local community organizations to learn more about the program and how their neighbors can engage in it.
