Prior to his role at BNYDC, Ehrenberg served as the executive vice president at the New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC), where he managed several of the city's pivotal economic development projects, including the creation of Cornell University's Roosevelt Island campus, the redevelopment of vacant land on the Lower East Side (Seward Park), and the Atlantic Yards project. He also oversaw the distribution of hundreds of millions of dollars in programs to support small businesses in the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy.

He holds a bachelor's degree from Wesleyan University and has earned dual master's degrees from Princeton University, specializing in Public Policy and Urban Planning.
